Task 1 Higher Level Geography:

Read the article (link below) and answer the following questions.

Part 1: Vocabulary

- 1. Demolition What does this term mean in the context of the article?
- 2. Unaccompanied children Who are they, and why is their situation significant?

Part 2: Questions

- 1. Summary: Summarise the key points of the article in your own words. What is the main issue being discussed?
- 2. Context: What was the Calais Jungle, and why was it demolished?
- 3. Current Situation: Describe the current conditions in Calais according to the article. How many migrants are there, and what challenges do they face?
- 4. Human Impact: Provide examples from the article that illustrate the human impact of the demolition of the Calais Jungle. Include at least one story or quote from a migrant.
- **5. Responses**: What actions have been taken by local authorities and organisations to address the migrant situation in Calais?
- **6. Challenges**: What are some of the ongoing challenges mentioned in the article for both the migrants and the authorities?
- 7. Future Outlook: Based on the article, what is the outlook for migrants currently living in Calais?

Part 3: Critical Thinking

- 1. **Perspective**: How does the author of the article convey the emotions and experiences of the migrants? Provide specific examples.
- 2. Comparison: Compare the situation in Calais with another migrant crisis you are aware of. What similarities and differences do you notice?
- 3. Solution Proposals: What solutions can you propose to improve the situation for migrants in Calais? Consider both short-term and long-term approaches.

Part 4: Personal Reflection

- 1. Empathy: How did reading this article make you feel about the plight of the migrants in Calais? Why?
- 2. Action: What steps, if any, do you think individuals or communities can take to support migrants in situations like those described in the article?
